Suo Gân (pronounced SEE-oh Gahn, literally meaning "murmuring song") is a lullaby set to a traditional Welsh melody. The Welsh lyrics were written by Robert Bryan (1858-1920), and are a mother's reassurance to her sleeping baby that he may rest safely on her bosom, there is nothing but the rustling leaves and the murmuring waves to disturb his slumber.
